




When you ask **Jean Lefort** how he is, he always responds, "I'm great, kid! How about you?"

He lives at Josephine Commons, in the same building as our offices, with his little Boston Terrier, Penny. Penny is a sweet, gentle dog and a marvelous companion. But, she also has a very

important job she is a registered therapy dog. Together, the two make a winsome team.

They serve on the "Eleventh Hour Team," providing respite care for families whose loved ones are close to death. Team members ease family members' minds with the promise that, if their loved one dies when family must step out, the patient won't die alone.

Jean says when he is alone with a patient, he salutes that individual. He says once he saluted a man who was unconscious, paralyzed from a stroke and near death. When Jean saluted, the patient moved his shoulder forward—faintly, but clearly, returning the salute.

The kitchen crew often remarks that, if they suddenly weren't able to come in, Connie Rouley could run the whole show.

And, it is true. Connie, who began volunteering weekly in the kitchen four years ago, is a dynamo. CCMOW's garde manger, Lisa, says Connie can



make 150 entrée salads without breaking a sweat. And when Chef Brett is creating the menu, he puts the more complicated dishes on Thursdays because he knows Connie will be here. She is efficient, friendly and optimistic.

Connie is retired from a 32-year career as a bank manager, and with her partner, Sid Copeland, loved fostering puppies and kittens for the Boulder Valley Humane Society.

She and Sid were together for 25 years until he became ill and died five years ago. He worked at the Louisville water plant for many years, and shortly before he died, they renamed it the Sid Copeland Water Plant. He also volunteered with the Lafayette Fire Department. It was a tragic loss, certainly for Connie and her kids, and also for the community.

After Sid's death, Connie knew she needed to do something. She learned of CCMOW, and, since she had just taken a knife skills class, she decided to volunteer in the kitchen. She says CCMOW came along at just the right time. "It was just what I needed."
